PERFORMANCE CLINIC

The MEPSA Performance clinic — Is it for you?

For some years, some of us in the Open division have eyed the Novice division with some envy \dots . We wanted someone to advise US – on performance showing! But as everyone knows, Open division showers cannot show in Novice. Two years ago we introduced a specialty qualifier to help Open showers interested in competing in the performance divisions. The Performance Clinic returns this season!

This is your chance to have a knowledgeable judge critique your OPEN DIVISION performance photos. This year the show is on October 28, so get busy and make new props, shoot new photos, and label them well (INCLUDING a pattern and description of the performance, where applicable) ... See you there!

October 28, 2017 Performance Clinic Special Qualifier - this limited entry show is for both E & F and the judge will provide showers with individual feedback on their performance entries. Limit 20 pictures per one division (20 total) or fifteen pictures for each division (30 total)

Judges – Important reminder

There are a number of "other performance" classes which allow multiple entries. It is important/critical/required that the judge states what the performance is along with the horses name in the results, *even if only one photo of the horse is entered*. This is so the tabulators can record what **horse AND performance** are qualified, as the same horse could qualify a number of times with different performance entries in the "other performance" classes. In addition, for class 119, scene, the name of the scene must be recorded in the results.

Showers: make sure you give your scene a unique name.

FEATURE ARTICLE

What color is my Appy?

This year, in Division A, we have made some permanent splits so that we can recognize more worthy horses in the championship show. One of those splits is in appaloosa color: 53a, blanket patterns, and 53b, other patterns. This has really challenged us to understand our appaloosa patterns!

All appaloosas have the "Leopard complex": characterized by striped hooves (on solid color legs), mottled skin, white sclera, and varnish roan. Varnish roan is a progressive change (like grey), resulting in color loss with age, which may reveal small spots, as well as leaving residual color over bony areas. It is possible to have no additional pattern genes and just be a "varnish roan" appaloosa (class 53b), or a horse may carry additional pattern and modifier genes. A horse must carry the gene for leopard complex (Lp) in order to express any appaloosa "Pattern" genes it may carry. If it carries two (LpLp) genes, there will be no (few) spots expressed, colored legs will have shell colored hooves with a few dark stripes, and the horse will have night blindness.

Although there are a number of recognized appaloosa patterns, only the "PATN 1" gene has been located. Pattern 1 is "leopard". The horse is born with a white or mostly white basecoat. There may be color on legs, joints, elbows, head and neck, which will varnish out with age. With a single Lp gene, the horse will be white with spots all over ("nose to toes", class 53b). With LpLp (homozygous for leopard complex), the horse will be born white or mostly white (no spots). In other words, a horse that is homozygous for Leopard complex and carrying PATN1 could be pure white, and should be shown along with homozygous sabino in class 56 as a "genetic

white horse", or it may have some color and show in class 53b. PATN1 may be modified by other genes. For example, the leopard pattern may be shrunken to a blanket size – with proportionately shrunken or elongated spots. Because it is hard to tell this modified pattern from a true blanket pattern, these should be entered in the blanket class (class 53a).

There are several other recognized appaloosa patterns, including blanket, frosted, and snowflake. In the blanket pattern, the horse is born with a white pattern across the hips and sometimes extending forward. The blanket will have spots if the horse is heterozygous Lp. If the horse is LpLp, the blanket will have no spots (called a "snow cap" pattern). Both of these blanket patterns show in class 53a. The frosted pattern involves white hairs amongst colored hairs (like roaning) mostly along the topside. The Snowflake pattern appears as small white spots that may be distributed all over the horse. Frosted and snowflake appaloosas show in class 53b.


