January 15 deadline - Writing Contest

Prize: U/P AR Brio Sombra sculpted by Sheila Bishop, SM scale

- We need both longer and shorter articles. 1000-3000 words is the length to shoot for.
- Text should be formatted in Microsoft Word (.doc) or .rtf or .txt.
- Name your text file using your last name (e.g. jones.doc).
- Do not embed images in your article. Send the illustrations for your article as separate .jpg files (no more than 2mb each), named using your last name and the figure number (e.g. "jonesfig1.jpg"). Illustrations must be original or used by permission from the source. Provide a source for each illustration as they will be listed in the figure captions (e.g. photo by Corina Roberts). Illustrations are an essential part of almost any article.
- You may include a short byline describing yourself/credentials/place in the hobby.
- Choose a subject related to model horses in which you are knowledgeable. Here are some examples that would be topics of interest:

- Performance-the tack, rules, setting, etc. illustrated with photos of real horses/tack and/or model horses.
 - Customizing how to ... (paint, resculpt, do hooves, braid a mane, etc.)
 - How to make tack a halter, bridle, saddle, costume ...
 - How to make props
- Breeds (e.g. "Tiger Horse", "exotics") with real horse illustrations. If you breed, keep or train horses, speak from your experience and illustrate with your horses! What model horses best represent your breed? Why?
 - Photography share your special tips on model horse photography with our readers!
 - Model horse manufacturers: a history of Hagen Renacker or Breyer or artist resins ...
- Fiction/poetry We are willing to accept these submissions. Of course they should be horse related. We will not be printing more than one "creative work" in the Champ book. Others may appear in the club newsletter.
- Other similar subjects of interest to photo model horse showers. To see an example MEPSA Championship book, go to Lulu.com, search for MEPSA, and look at a preview.

February 28 deadline - Custom Contest / Lady Phase

Prize: U/P AR Maggie Bennett Traditional model - TBA either Tumbleweed or Amarant

Winners will chosen from a poll on MEPSA'S blog that will be advertised on MHSP, ModelHorseBlab and Facebook.

Make over a Traditional scale Lady Phase any way you want, with some customization when compared to the original mold. It can be minimum, like a mane and tail or head position change, or a drastic custom -it's up to you! One body is available to a live show proven artist, please inquire. Otherwise, artists must provide their own body. Get the body soon, so you have plenty of time to work!.

Artist provides the model to be customized. The model must fit the criteria (in this case, Breyer Lady Phase) of the contest it was meant to be entered into. Each entrant may enter one model.

Artist may use any technique, any materials, and customize the model and/or item any way they choose. The model customizing contests are open to any equid- not only horses, but donkeys, zebras, fantasy equines, etc.

All finished models and/or items must have a clear digital or scanned photo of each side, sent in to MEPSA-Shana Bobbitt starfroggie@gmail.com MEPSA can do the photographs for you if needed, when we get the model or item.

ALL entered models and/or items become property of MEPSA to raise funds or use as Championship show awards. This is a MEPSA Benefit contest. Artist must send the finished model to MEPSA upon completion at their own expense. There is no other fee to enter.

The contest will be publicized heavily on the Internet and in model horse groups. Please help spread the word!

We will adhere to the deadlines mentioned should we receive enough entries for that contest. MEPSA reserves the right to extend the deadlines should there not be enough entries. Voting will take place within a month after the latest expressed deadline.

Winners will be selected by majority vote on MEPSA's blog, when the contest entries are announced and the voting completed. Winners will be notified via email or snail mail.

Judges - Important reminder -

There are a number of "other performance" classes which allow multiple entries. It is important/critical/required that the judge states what the performance is along with the horses name in the results, *even if* only one photo of the horse is entered. This is so the tabulators can record what **horse AND performance** are qualified, as the same horse could qualify a number of times with different performance entries in the "other performance" classes. In addition, for class 119, scene, the name of the scene must be recorded in the results. **Showers:** *make sure you give your scene a unique name.*

PLEASE DO NOT send catalogs or other heavy items. And apply the golden rule "Donate to others what you would like to see in your own champ show box!"

Track your 2018-19 donations using the Donor record:

At the end of the season, did you have trouble remembering what you donated so that you knew what size ad you should get in the Championship book (well guess what so did the champ show coordinator!)? Don't let that happen again! Start keeping a list of your donations today! (and help out the coordinators!) Form available at http://mepsa1.tripod.com/forms.html. Record each donation and the value. You can also record judge's fees donated. Get credit for all you do for MEPSA! Value of contest entries should not be included as these have their own separate reward system. Submit your donation record at the end of the season (or with your championship entry). This will make record keeping easier for the BOD. All donors receive ad space in the Championship book. Donate \$100 – get a full page, \$50 gets you half a page and \$25 gets you a quarter page ad. Become a patron level sponsor by donating \$150 or more and get your champ show book (a \$35 value) for free!

New — submit your short model-horse-related announcement for publication in the quarterly newsletter

We often have a little extra room, and I will be happy to publish short announcements about your horse club or other news, as space allows. Also, I will happily accept short articles, and as you know, any articles submitted for the writing contest that do not make it into the Champ show book will probably be published here.

It's that time again! With the new show season on its way this is the perfect time to get your MEPSA Show Coupons. They are a great alternative to sending checks or cash with your photos and takes some stress off of your judges about needing to keep track of actual funds to send back to MEPSA. :-)

Show Coupons

You may request show coupons from the Treasurer, Carolyn Bailey (MEPSA contacts page:http://mepsa1.tripod.com/officers.html). Send one check or paypal (mepsa3@att.net) payment and receive coupons for show entry. Cash equivalent coupons can be made in any denominations you need. You may receive your coupons electronically or by mail. Each will have a serial number so they can only be used one time. Simply enclose the value needed in place of cash or check in your entry. For example: for 100 halter photos, enclose one \$4 coupon or two \$2 coupons, etc. No more cash in the mail, no more check fees — entering shows just got easier!

Photo Sizes:

4x6 is preferred for consistency and ease of handling for the judges. 4x5.25 and 3x5 allowed but not encouraged. Any other size may be disqualified by the judge.

Also, if your photo doesn't "fill out" a 4x6 (has white margins at top and/or sides) please do not trim the photo down! A photo will not be disqualified for having extra white around the image. When you are in whichever photo program you use to adjust your photos, just center your cropped image in the 4x6 space and you will be fine (see sample below). :-)



Return Envelopes:

A self-addressed stamped envelope (SASE) is needed for all show entries to return your photos.

Please adhere the proper postage before sending your photos, most judges won't have extra stamps and trying to have the postage added at the post office while you are handling a show's worth of envelopes isn't easy (not to mention the irritated people standing in line behind you while you finish packaging those entries!).

You can purchase prepaid flat rate priority envelopes from USPS at no extra charge (you just pay the postage) and you don't have to have stamps on hand for your show return envelopes, or worry about the stamps being taped over. Since you need to fit the return envelope into your out-going envelope, make sure that all of your entries will still fit.

Online postage is easy to use if you can't get to the post office often and you don't need an expensive mail scale to weigh your entries. I use our food scale (which cost us just over \$10) without any issues. :-)

Another thing to keep an eye out for is changes in postage rates. If the rates have changed after you have sent out your entries it would be a good idea to contact the judge(s) to make sure you are covered. If needed, postage shortages can be rectified by either sending the extra postage/stamps to the judge or making arrangements with the show coordinator or treasurer to repay MEPSA for covering the shortage.

Labeling and Pre-Sorting Photo Entries:

These steps are very important for helping the judges get the shows done in a timely manner.

- 1) Make sure your photos have the correct class numbers on them. The breed directory should help determine which class your horse should go into http://mepsa1.tripod.com/rft-doc-pdf/MEPSABREEDDIRECTORY.rtf . If you are not sure feel free to post or contact a board member directly and we will be glad to help. :-)
- 2) Make sure performance photos have appropriate descriptions or identifiers. Performance photos need to have appropriate descriptions or identifiers so the judge knows what the horse is supposed to be doing. It is also very important to have these descriptions and identifiers for classes that allow more than one entry for each horse. Without the description or identifier, the show tabulators will not know which photo qualified in the class and the wrong photo may get the credit for the placing.
- 3) Make sure your photos are pre-sorted into their first classes before they go to the show judge. A show must be sorted multiple times and it is a time consuming task with the number of photos that arrive for each show. Having your entries already sorted into their first classes helps the judges start their show sooner and have one less sort to do. Remember, the judges may have 3 weeks to judge but they also have jobs, family, etc. on top of all the sorting, judging, typing, re-packaging photos to mail and the required "paperwork" that goes with each show.
