The MEPSA Board of Directors

...without whom there would be no MEPSA. The board meets monthly (online) to report on our activities and discuss club needs. The board **president** manages seasonal activities and maintains an overall vision for the club. The **VP** acts as a back up for the president, and is the outreach coordinator. The secretary keeps a record of board business during the board meetings and coordinates the annual election. The treasurer maintains an account of our funds. The cost of the championship is about \$5000 per year. These costs include ribbons, rosettes and other prizes, the results book, shipping, and judging stipends. The club also has other expenses including the website(s). Funds to support the championship come from qualifier and championship entry fees, donations, and fund raisers (such as those listed above). Fund raising allows us to offer more and better prizes and having a donations coordinator (DC) makes all the difference. As we search for a new DC, we look for someone with experience with online selling as well as contacts in the model horse community both for acquisition of prizes for contests and potential participants in our contests. The generosity of the artist community has been invaluable to MEPSAs success. You can also get involved by participating in contests: e.g. painting models or making tack. Our Website coordinator is gradually migrating us to a new website. This year we have just one **champ show coordinator**. She is handling book production in addition to verifying entries and managing championship judges and donations and awarding prizes. Would you be interested in publishing the book? The Novice Coordinator runs all aspects of that program.

Board positions are voluntary, but each board member is rewarded annually with a free Champ show Book.

Corina Roberts has stepped up to run for president! So Elizabeth Jones has volunteered to take the VP position. Join us behind the curtain! I'm sure we can find a place for you. It's a great place to volunteer!

How do models qualify to enter the Annual Championship? Qualification Information:

- Your model qualifies at any of the MEPSA qualifier shows, by placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd (in Div A only 4th, 5th or 6th in classes with over 100 entries). It is then eligible to enter the Championship Photo Show. It is the model which qualifies, NOT the photo. You should submit your best photo for the championship, and we encourage you to strive to improve your photography skills throughout your showing career.
- Halter- Qualification in any Halter class enables the model to show in all Halter division classes at the Championship Show. For example: your horse gets a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in her Breed class, she now qualifies to go to the Championship Show and enter gender, breed, color and make classes.
- Performance- Models are only eligible to enter championship classes in which they qualified. For example, your horse places 1st, 2nd or 3rd in Western Pleasure and Jumper, then those are the only two performance classes that model is eligible for at the Championship Show.
- Entrants must keep track of their own qualifiers. No lists will be sent by MEPSA.
- On the website, under <u>MEPSA Forms for Download</u>, there is a Correction Sheet for any errors that may be found in the results (misspelled names, incorrect 5-letter codes, etc).

SHOWING RULES:

- Mail-in entries only. Online or emailed photos will not be accepted.
- For each show, a SASE (Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope) with adequate postage to return photos to you, is required. Full results will be sent to all entrants digitally. If a hardcopy is required, you must request this of the judge and provide the additional return postage.
- See below for more information on the various classes.
- See below, the first quarter schedule of shows, judges, entry limits, etc.
- Make checks payable to the judge. Paypal fees may be sent to mepsa3@att.net. Show coupons are available from the Treasurer, Carolyn Bailey at mepsa3@att.net. You may use Paypal or mail a check to Carolyn Bailey, 4N742 Honey Hill Cir., Wayne, IL 60184. Show coupons are available in denominations from \$1-\$8. They

may be used for any show, including the Other Animal Specialty and the Championship Show. They are a great alternative to sending cash or checks to the individual shows.

• Entry fees:

Halter/Performance 1-15 photos - \$1.00 16-50 photos - \$2.00 51-100 photos \$4.00 101-150 photos - \$5.00 151-200 photos - \$6.00

Performance Only 201-250 photos – \$7.00 251-300 photos – \$8.00

- MEPSA allows the use of digital cameras for photography. Please note and observe the following rules regarding ALL photos:
 - NO PHOTO MANIPULATION ALLOWED Photos suspected of any manipulation will be pulled from competition at the judge's discretion. "Manipulation" as set forth by the MEPSA Board of Directors includes, but is not limited to:
 - Digitally or otherwise adding, changing or deleting backgrounds, props, riders, tack ,etc.
 - Altering the appearance of the horse in any manner
 - Minor standard adjustments will be allowed, such as color balance, brightness applied to the entire photo, or cropping.
 - Standard photo sizes only and should be of a uniform size. 4×6 photos are preferred; any other size adds extra work for the judge. However, standard sizes 4×5.25 and 3×5 are also allowed. Any other size may be disqualified by the judge.
 - For digital photography, avoid low resolution images, such as 72dpi. This will produce a poor, grainy image that may not show well.
 - If you are printing your own pictures, use a high quality photo paper. Avoid thin and flimsy paper. This will not show off your model to its best advantage and is more likely to become wrinkled and damaged. Also remember the quality of the printer will affect the quality of the photo. A poor quality, low-end printer may not produce the best results.
 - Photos, in Halter, should fill the frame with the model, and the remaining background shouldn't be distracting, dark or overly busy. In Performance, the photo should include any props needed for the discipline, but the model and tack should still be visible.
- Photo Backs:

- Please mark the back of each photo with the appropriate division letter, the class number(s), the model's name, breed, gender, color and collectibility info (as needed for OF models).
- Your name, address and 5 letter code (1st two letters of your first name, 1st three letters of your last name) should be on every photo, in case the photo is separated and needs to be returned to you. Make sure all information is current.
- Please make sure that the information is legible (readable fonts for printing, font sizes 10-12, in dark colors).
- It is helpful for the judges to have all of your photo backs the same, with the information in the same locations on each photo. Class numbers are preferred in the middle and address labels in the bottom corner.
- You may also add a sticker, stamp, colorful or designed address labels, to your photo backs to make them unique. This will help the judge when sorting the photos to mail them home.

• Halter entries:

- Halter entries may enter one gender, one breed, one color and one collectability/workmanship class with one photo.
- Adults and foals compete together, except in the gender classes.
- We encourage the addition of Collectability or Workmanship information.
- You can download a list of <u>Current Traditional Breyers</u> for Class 58 and a <u>Breed Directory</u>, indicating which class a specific breed is recommended to enter. A mixed breed may enter whichever mixed class the owner feels is best for their model.
- Fantasy/Decorator models may compete in all four divisions, but please use the Fantasy/Decorator Breed and Color and applicable Gender (if any) and Collectability/Workmanship classes.

• Performance entries:

- One photo per class per model, unless otherwise noted on the class list. No photo may be used in more than one class per show.
- Please include a description of the entry. Adding extra information, including patterns or movements can be helpful to the judge.
- A list of <u>Speed vs. Skill Games</u> can be downloaded.
- There is an annual Performance Clinic available to people who are looking for help with their performance entries. Photos are critiqued and qualifying entries are eligible for the Championship Show.
- The are also HELP (Helping Everyone Learn about Performance) classes. These classes are strictly for informational purposes only. Photos will be critiqued, but not eligible for qualifications or Championships.

- Headstudy classes are available in both Halter and Performance shows. They do not compete for Championships in any Division.
- We have a number of Mini Specialty shows during the year and a special Mini Division in our Championship Show.
 - Minis are Stablemate, Little Bit, CollectA, Chips, Pebbles and similar sized models 4" or smaller 9 (excluding Classic scale foals).
 - Minis may show in either the regular or mini Division of the Championship Show, but not both, regardless of which Division they qualified in.
- There are Six Divisions in the Open series. Please mark each photo with the appropriate letter.
 - Division A
 - Original Finish Plastic (Breyer, Peter Stone, CollectA, Schleich, Hartland, Ertl, Winner's Choice, etc.)
 - Division B
 - Original Finish China/Resin (Hagen-Renaker, Beswick, BHR, BFA, Corlette, Breyer Porcelains, etc.)
 - Division C
 - Artist Resin/Original Sculpture (Resins produced by an artist and finished by artists, such as those produced by Mountain View Studios, DaBar, etc. OS being one-of-a-kind pieces sculpted/finished by the artist)
 - Division D
 - Customs (Any factory-produced model that has been altered in any way from it's original form by an artist, included Custom Glazed china/ceramic pieces)
 - Division E
 - Original Finish Performance (OF Plastic, OF China, OF Resin, etc.)
 - Division F
 - Custom Performance (Any and all customized/Artist Resin/OS models)
- Novice Division
 - We have a Novice Series for entrants who are just learning about photo showing. See below for more details.

Open Series 2021-22

It's a new show season! Although class numbers have not changed, there are a few classes you should check. Is your current Breyer still current? Has your recently discontinued Breyer aged into vintage? Is your stablemate in the right subclass? And most importantly, do you have photos

that simply have the wrong numbers – from an old classlist or another club. Wrong class numbers are frequently cited by judges and they make judging more difficult, so please double check every photo back. Good Luck!

RULES: Mail-in entries only. Printed digital photos (with only cropping and color corrections made; no items added, changed, or deleted) and preferably 4X6 in size, may be entered. Online/emailed entries are not accepted. Please mark each photo with the appropriate division letter, the class number(s), the model's name, breed, gender and color, and your name, address and 5 letter code (1st two letters of your first name, 1st three letters of your last name). Collectability or Workmanship information is strongly encouraged. In Performance, please have a description of the entry, including any pattern or movement. A list of Current Breyers, Speed and Skill Games, and a Breed Directory, indicating which class a specific breed is recommended to enter, are located on the website. A mixed breed may enter whichever mixed class the owner feels is best for their model. One photo per class, unless otherwise noted on class list. Classes with over 50 entries may be split at judge's discretion. Models that place 1st, 2nd, or 3rd (1st-6th in classes of 100 or more) qualify to enter the year-end MEPSA Championship Show! Entrants must keep track of their own qualifiers. SASE with adequate postage required for each show. Full results to all entrants. Make any checks payable to the judge. Paypal fees may be sent to mepsa3@att.net. Show coupons are available from the Treasurer, Carolyn Bailey at mepsa3@att.net.

NOVICE show series (see below for judges)

The MEPSA Novice Photo Show Series provides newcomers with an opportunity to learn how to improve their photo show entries by using direct feedback. Entrants will be given individual private critiques on EVERY photo they enter, thus allowing them to see exactly what they can improve on. Photos will also be judged against one another (just like a regular photo show) and full results will be given to all entrants.

Some rules to remember:

Showers CANNOT enter Novice shows and OPEN shows at the same time. There is a maximum of 2 years allowed in Novice for showers over 16. Age 16 and under, the maximum is 3 years. Graduating from Novice will occur prior to the maximum allowed time, when the majority of judges recommend moving up to Open. A shower may elect to move on to Open on their own at any time. It is recommended that a shower take advantage

of the Novice shows and enter as many as possible. The Novice Division is designed to help you improve your photography, but the judge can also help you with other details, such as breed assignment, labeling your photo back, etc.

Novice showers may move up to the Open division, which also includes all Specialty shows, at any time. However, if they choose to do this, they CANNOT enter any further Novice shows and must forfeit all qualifications in the Novice Division. Once moved to Open, they cannot show in the Novice Division. All photography must be done by the entrant, no professional photography allowed. All Original Finish Plastic or China (OF), Custom (CM) and Artist Resin (AR) horses welcome.

FEES AND RULES: \$2.00 per show. PLEASE make check/MO out to the judge, not MEPSA! Entrants may not enter more than 15 photos per show. All photos will be individually critiqued by the photo show judge and entrants will be given constructive criticism on how to improve their entries. Horses that place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any halter class in this series ARE eligible for the MEPSA Novice Halter Championship division and, in Performance, any horse placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd are eligible for the Championship Novice Performance division in the class they place in only!! The show format changes every other month. Shows in ODD months are halter shows and shows in EVEN months are performance shows.

STANDARD PHOTO SIZES ONLY – Show photos should be of uniform size. 4×6 photos are preferred, but 4×5.25 and 3×5 are also allowed. Any other size may be disqualified by the judge.

Entrants may enter one photo per horse in Halter. Enter each photo in one gender class and one breed class. Example: An Arabian Stallion photo would be entered in classes 1, 5, while a Clydesdale gelding would be entered in 3, 8. You do not need separate photos for both sections.

In Performance, it is one photo per horse per class in classes 13, 14, 18, 19. The remainder may have multiple photos of the horse as long as they are of different disciplines, i.e. Roping and Cutting in Western Stock Class or Arabian and Native American in Costumes.

Duplicate entries will be DQ'd.

HOW TO ENTER:

The information needed on your photo back:

Horse's name, breed, gender, color and make/mold information should be printed or written in ink on a label. Do not write directly on photo backs as it will smear and often transfers to other photos in humid conditions. DON'T use a Sharpie or any marker type pen as they can bleed right through the photo.

Class or classes entered – In Halter, this will be two classes, one for gender and one for breed type. In Performance, this will be only one class, and it helps to explain what your horse is doing. (Use pencil on a blank label. Some use scotch tape, but I dislike it as the pencil fades over time and the tape itself can leave sticky spots. Pencil is used so you can erase and remark the class numbers).

Your full name, your street address, city, state, zip code, email address and your five letter entrant ID code (1st two letters of 1st name and first three letters of last name-example: Marie Phillips-maphi). An address label is perfect and preferred for this information, but you may write it in pen on a blank label. Be sure it's readable! Bigger is better.)

Showers should put their photos in a ziplock bag to keep them clean, dry and together. It is not mandatory to do this, but it is good practice to keep your photos safe and should the envelope be damaged, they will get back to the shower.

WHAT TO SEND:

Don't forget your entry fee, to make sure your name and address is on EVERY photo back, that your classes are marked on every photo back, and that you have enclosed that very important SASE! What is an SASE? It's an envelope you have addressed to yourself, with that show's judge's address as the return, that is LARGE enough to fit all your photos and results if needed, and is PRE-STAMPED with enough postage to mail home all your photos and results, unless you get your results by email. This is very important, because otherwise, the judge cannot return your photos to you! You need to put at least the same amount of stamps on the return envelope as it takes to send your package to the judge. A lot of veteran showers will put an extra stamp in their photo bag with their name written on the back of the stamp in ink (just in case).

Shows will run the third Saturday of every month.
