From our MEPSA President, important news! It is that time of year again. The Champ show entries are in and the wait begins. What should you do with all your free time? Check out our updated class lists and soon, our show schedule! We have made a number of changes for the 2024-2025 season.

First of all, we have upgraded the Mini Specialties to monthly Qualifiers!! Yes, the Minis get their own monthly halter shows. However, they will no longer be allowed in the regular Div. A/B/C/D shows. All Minis will show and qualify in the monthly Mini shows and Mini sections of the Vintage and Foal Specialties, for the Mini division in the Championship Show. We have expanded the collectability classes as well.

Second, the Mini performance will remain with the monthly Div. E/F/I qualifiers. We have expanded the Mini Performance classes. We have split Roping/Cutting, Barrels/Poles, Hunter/Jumper and added three new classes: Western Riding, Cross Country, and Scene.

Third, we have also expanded the Collectability classes in Div. A. Recent Discontinued has been split in two, Vintage Discontinued into three! Classic has been split in two, as well. Div. A/B/C have had their Mini classes removed.

There are no changes to Div. D/E/F, nor to the Gender, Breed, or Color classes.

What does all of this really mean?? It means that you will need to check each and every photo's class numbers. Many will need to be updated. Even if you don't think it has changed, it is a good time to double check that your class numbers are correct. Many judges complained of incorrect class numbers and the time it takes to deal with them, (if they are moving them or writing post it notes). If they are simply disqualifying them, they aren't going to the Championship show! Make our judges happy, check your class numbers!!

DEAR APPY

Dear Appy:

I am wondering whether I should use a rider doll in my performance entries or not. The entries with dolls always do better than ones without, right?

To Rider or Not to Rider

Dear To Rider or Not to Rider,

Having a rider doll can boost your entry, but only if it is the right doll, sitting in the proper position, holding the reins correctly. If not, then a rider can actually hurt your entry. Assuming the tack and model are equal, if the judge has an entry with a rider with poor leg position, holding the reins wrong, or looking in the wrong direction, etc. and an entry with no rider, the entry without a rider will do better. A doll does not solve other problems, either. If the tack is sloppy or the model is inappropriate for the task, a rider isn't going to help. If the two entries are equal except that one has a correct rider and the other does not have one, then the rider will get you extra credit. You need to put together the best entry you can. If you can present a proper rider, go for it; if not, leave it off.

PHOTO TIPS, HINTS, AND PET PEEVES

Last April it was my privilege to judge the monthly BCD Qualifier show. It was my first photo show to judge in about 30 years! Prior to that I had judged quite a few, but none so large as the April BCD with over 900 photos in it! Staying organized was the key there – but that's a subject for another article some other time.

In many ways, the quality of photos today is superior to those of 30 years ago. Most obvious is the fact that we now have digital cameras! We don't have to develop and pay for an entire roll of film only to find out that half of them were flops, unfit for showing. In other ways, nothing has changed in 30 years – your job as a shower is to present your model horse in the best manner possible for you. Whether you own a fancy-shmancy superexpensive digital camera or are using your phone, here are a few things to keep in mind, based on what I saw at the April BCD...and also 30+ years ago.

<u>AIRPLANE VIEWS:</u> I know it can be hard, especially with Stablemates and micro-minis now, but you must get your camera down to about shoulder-level with the model. Miniaturize yourself in your mind and imagine you are in scale with your model, studying it as a judge would. The judge needs a level view to observe the horse's conformation. If I, as a judge, cannot see some important aspect of the model, no matter how beautiful it might be, I will move on and choose a model on which I can see more. Airplane views also greatly detract from realism and make the horse instantly look like a toy.

EXTREME ANGLES: Some models look very dynamic when photographed from a slight angle such as quartering-to to show off a beautiful face, or quartering-away to show off that nice QH butt! But when a model is shown at too much of angle, you are obscuring the judge's view to other important aspects of the model's conformation such as shoulder angle, straightness of back, shape of rump, etc. If I am left to guess or assume what's there...I will place it lower than a model I can see. I will also wonder what flaw you may be trying to disguise.

NOT CENTERED: It just plain looks bad to have a model not in the center of the photo. It might not affect my ability to see the model's conformation, but in a tough class with other identical models (think OF Breyer Proud Arabian Mares), if they are all centered and presented well but yours is off to one side or the other...yours is more likely to be placed down. It's "showmanship" on your part.

NOT CLOSE ENOUGH: With today's digital cameras and phones this isn't too much of an issue, but just bear in mind that, as with the centering issue mentioned above, presenting a model too far away to see detail is annoying to the judge as well, and you'll be placed below someone else who got in close to their model.

TOO DARK/ANNOYING SHADOWS (your shadow!) ON MODEL: Obscures detail; you'll place lower. The model's shadow thrown against a natural background (such as on the sky) sucks the realism right out of the photo as well.

BACKGROUND TOO BUSY: Natural-looking backgrounds can be great, but always be aware of what's there. Anything that detracts attention from the model must be moved out of view. If you can't move it (bulldozers, unsuitable buildings, etc.) you MUST move your venue to a more suitable area. I recently discovered that even a backdrop of trees can be terribly distracting if it's all mottled lights and darks against the sky; put a dappled grey or leopard appaloosa in front of that and they'll virtually disappear, leaving the judge to wonder at detail and conformation again. (White models might do okay.)

SAME MOLD/SAME BACKGROUND: I know it can be difficult to come up with varied backgrounds, but if you have multiple models of the same mold, and they are all photographed in front of the very same background, the judge might......yawn......and their eyes.....glaze over.....as they move on to more interesting photos! Even if you only own one background, try to vary the similar models' positions slightly, or change the lighting, or use some interesting in-scale props off to one side or other, or include a handler, or even a model cat or dog to one side.

EXTREME POSITIONS: Some models are in very extreme positions – rearing, bucking, lying, rolling, playing – which make judging their conformation difficult. These models can still be shown with great success, but they might not place as highly in their breed class as their moderately-posed classmates, breed classes being

dependent on seeing conformation. Just set them up so the judge can see as much of their key points as possible, and as always – detail! If the photo is well done, the model may place better in the color, collectability, or workmanship classes.

HOOFS BURIED: "No hoof, no horse" is the old saying. If your model's hoofs are buried in your footing material such that the judge can't see them, it is likely to place lower than the model whose hoofs are visible. I'm tellin' ya – the competition is so tough that little details like this can make a difference, especially in an Appaloosa class, for instance, where I want to see if the light hoofs have any striping. It also makes a difference in workmanship classes – well-detailed hoofs may place a model higher than one with plain hoofs.

AND PET PEEVE #1: If your model has been customized or is an artist resin, PLEASE give credit to the artist(s)! Artists rely on your photos as a way of exhibiting their skill. If they signed the model or if you know who created it, they deserve to have their hard work acknowledged. For those who show performance, it is also courteous to recognize tack and obstacle makers. And if you have hired a professional to photograph your model(s), by all means give them photo credit! This is good showmanship.

PET PEEVE #2: Sloppy photo backs. Judges get eye-weary; there's an awful lot to look at in a show with 900+ photos! Exercise good showmanship by presenting the judge with neatly done photo backs. Clearly show *all the info required by MEPSA* in a neat format, whether *neatly* hand-written or typed in a font of reasonable size. (Your humble editor agrees with this one 100%)

Novices and veterans alike can all fall prey to some of these issues I've mentioned here – myself included! Never settle for "good enough." Always strive for the best you can do, and when you've done that, start looking for ways you can improve still more for your next photo shoot. As your photos improve, so will your placings.

NOVICE SHOWS

The MEPSA Novice Photo Show Series provides newcomers with an opportunity to learn how to improve their photo show entries by using direct feedback. Entrants will be given individual private critiques on EVERY photo they enter, thus allowing them to see exactly what they can improve on. Photos will also be judged against one another (just like a regular photo show) and full results will be given to all entrants.

Some rules to remember:

Showers CANNOT enter Novice shows and OPEN shows at the same time. There is a maximum of 2 years allowed in Novice for showers over 16. Age 16 and under, no maximum. Graduating from Novice may occur prior to the maximum allowed time, if the majority of judges recommend moving up to Open. A shower may elect to stay in Novice for the maximum two years. It is recommended that a shower take advantage of the Novice shows and enter as many as possible during the two year time limit.

The Novice Division is designed to help you improve your photography, but the judge can also help you with other details, such as breed assignment, labeling your photo back, etc.

Novice showers may move up to the Open division, which also includes all Specialty shows, at any time. However, if they choose to do this before season's end, they CANNOT enter any further Novice shows and must forfeit all qualifications in the Novice Division for that Season's Novice Division Championship show. Once moved to Open, they cannot show in the Novice Division. All photography must be done by the entrant, no professional photography allowed. All Original Finish Plastic or China (OF), Custom (CM) and Artist Resin (AR) horses welcome.

FEES AND RULES: \$2.00 per show. PLEASE make check/MO out to the judge, not MEPSA! Entrants may not enter more than 15 photos per show. All photos will be individually critiqued by the photo show judge and entrants will be given constructive criticism on how to improve their entries. Horses that place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any halter class in this series are eligible for the MEPSA Novice Halter Championship division and, in Performance, any horse placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd are eligible for the Championship Novice Performance division in the class they place in only!! The show format runs alternately, 2 halter, one Performance. (Halter-Aug, Sept, Perf-Oct, Halter-Nov, Dec, Perf-Jan, etc.)

STANDARD PHOTO SIZES ONLY – Show photos should be of uniform size. 4×6 photos are preferred, but 4×5.25 and 3×5 are also allowed. Any other size may be disqualified by the judge.

Entrants may enter one photo per horse in Halter. Enter each horse's photo in one gender class and one breed class. Example: An Arabian Stallion photo would be entered in classes 1, 5, while a Clydesdale gelding would be entered in 3, 8. You do not need separate photos for both sections. Do not send additional photos of other views. Pick the best side, and use that photo.

In Performance, it is one photo per horse per class in classes 13, 14, 18, 19. The remainder may have multiple photos of the horse as long as they are of different disciplines, i.e. Roping and Cutting in Western Stock Class or Arabian and Native American in Costumes. Duplicate photos will be DQ'd.

IMPORTANT: NEVER write or put sticky notes on the front of your photos! All information must be on the BACK of your photos! Never on the Front!!

HOW TO ENTER:

The information needed on your photo back:

Horse's name, breed, gender, color and make/mold information should be printed or written in ink on a label. Do not write directly on photo backs as it will smear and often transfers to other photos in humid conditions. DON'T use a Sharpie or any marker type pen as they can bleed right through the photo.

Class or classes entered – In Halter, this will be two classes, one for gender and one for breed type. In Performance, this will be only one class, and it helps to explain what your horse is doing. (Use pencil on a blank label. Some use scotch tape, but I dislike it as the pencil fades over time and the tape itself can leave sticky spots. Pencil is used so you can erase and remark the class numbers).

Your full name, your street address, city, state, zip code, email address and your five letter entrant ID code (1st two letters of 1st name and first three letters of last name-example: Marie Phillips-maphi). An address label is perfect and preferred for this information, but you may write it in pen on a blank label. Be sure it's readable! Bigger is better.)

Showers should put their photos in a ziplock bag to keep them clean, dry and together. It is not mandatory to do this, but it is good practice to keep your photos safe and should the envelope be damaged, they will get back to the shower.

WHAT TO SEND:

Don't forget your entry fee, and make sure your name and address is on EVERY photo back, be sure your classes are marked on every photo back, and that you have enclosed that very important SASE! What is an SASE? It's an envelope you have addressed to yourself, with that show's judge's address as the return, which is LARGE enough to fit all your photos, critiques, and results if needed, and is PRE-STAMPED with enough

postage to mail home your entries, critique and results. You may request email results, but often the critiques are sent with the pix. This is very important, because otherwise, the judge cannot return your photos to you! You need to put at least the same amount of stamps on the return envelope as it takes to send your package to the judge. A lot of veteran showers will put an extra stamp in their photo bag with their name written on the back of the stamp in ink (just in case). Some even use Priority mail both ways to make it easier for all involved.

Shows will run the third Saturday of every month.

Now for a tale of origins in the hobby from one of our members, Carolyn Bailey, our President! We hope you enjoyed the last submission in Volume 50!

Carolyn Bailey's Origin Story

I began life as an ordinary kid with a few obligatory Breyer models, the original Foundation Stallion, the bay appy Indian Pony, San Domingo, and the black stretch Morgan. For a long time that was all I had, outside of my love of the real thing. There was a short time when I had my own Chincoteague pony and took riding lessons. My parents were also into horses, but it was the Thoroughbred racing type. They lived in Kentucky or Florida, and we only got to see them a couple of times a year. I got married, moved away, and had kids. My life had moved on. I spent most of my time breeding show dogs and was President, Secretary, and Show Chairman during my time at the Great Lakes Poodle Club of Chicago, Inc.

When my daughter was 11, she wanted to learn to ride. Before we knew it, we all joined her taking lessons at a local hunter/jumper barn. The barn also was involved with the local Fox Hunt. It didn't take my husband long to fall for the adrenaline rush of fox hunting. Now we live in the Fox Hunt community, have three horses and work with the Hunt's hounds. My husband is a whipper-in, which means it is his job to keep the hounds safe while they are hunting. I lead the Car Caravan, a group of people in cars that follow the Hunt and watch the show.

I have been in the hobby for almost 30 years. I enjoy doing Performance, have done some minor customizing, have shown and judged in NAN qualifying shows, shown and judged photo shows. My collection includes mostly OF models, with a few Chinas, Resins and Customs to round out the mix. I have all sizes, including a large Stablemate collection. I was Vice-President of the Great Lakes Congress, Inc., the only 501c3 non-profit dedicated to education in the model horse hobby. I started showing with MEPSA in 1998. I was the Championship Show Coordinator for 5 years, then Treasurer for a number of years. Finally, when Liz Jones stepped down as our long time President, I stepped into her very large shoes.

I enjoy this hobby and hope to be involved with it for a long time to come.
