Dear Mystified,

The judge has many entrants' photos to judge. If they had to stop and look up each class for each photo, the show would never get done. It is your responsibility to have the proper class numbers. Also, keep in mind that some years, the class lists change. When that happens you have to correct the numbers on your photo backs. That is why MEPSA advises their members to double check each and every photo being sent to a show. That way, you will have the best chance to qualify your models!

Below is information to help you prepare for the June Championship show!

Mini Division – The halter sections of the Mini Division will have the same class numbers and classes as the normal Open Division. They will be combined into Division G - OF Plastic/OF China and Division H - AR/CM. The Mini Performance (Division I) will be combined OF/CM and use the modified Mini class list. Special Mini Division Instructions

The halter sections of the Mini Division will have the same class numbers and classes as the normal Open

Division. They will be combined into OF Plastic/China (Division G) and AR/CM (Division H). The Mini Division Performance will be combined OF/CM (Division I) and have the following modified classlist

For all other Divisions: Horses that have placed 1st-3rd (or 1st-6th in classes with 100 or more entries) in any halter class are eligible to enter all halter classes. Horses that have placed 1st-3rd in a performance class are eligible only for the specific class or classes in which they placed. The same class lists for OPEN and NOVICE are used for the Championship Show as for all of the qualifiers. There is no need to re-label your qualified horses.

In Performance, models who qualify more than the class limit in a multiple entry class may enter all photos qualified, as long as they are of different disciplines. (i.e. English Games, Other Stock Work (team penning, working cow horse, team roping, western working, etc), multiple costume entries in Other Costume, etc.

You may use existing photos of your horse, or you may submit new photos for the Championship Show. You are not required to use the actual qualified photo of the horse.

Digital Camera Users: No photographic altering is allowed. Photos may be cropped and slight color corrections can be made for the printing process. You may not alter the horse or background in any way.

MEPSA has a master list of all the qualified horses in each division. It is the owner's responsibility to keep track of their qualified horses. You will not receive a list of your qualified horses from MEPSA. The horses you send will be checked against the master list for accuracy. The Show Coordinator will contact you if there are any discrepancies. Please be sure she has a valid email address for you, or in the event you do not have email, a telephone number where you can be reached. If you know about a discrepancy already, please either contact our <u>Tabulator</u> or use a <u>Qualifier Correction sheet</u> with your entry for the Show Coordinator.

The fee schedule and all details regarding prizes and the championship show book are listed on the entry form. Please print, fill out and send the entry form with your qualified horses to the Show Coordinator.

Preparing Your Entries

Unlike the monthly shows, all qualified horses will be going to one Show Coordinator who will then re-sort them and send them on to individual judges for each division. Entries must be received as follows:

1) Separated by division in individual baggies with the entrant's name, the division, and the number of photos enclosed (example: Susie Jones, Division A, 49 photos).

2) Halter entries must be in **alphabetical order** by horse name. Performance horses are still sorted first by class, then alphabetically.

3) The back of each photo should have your horse's information, your five letter name code, your name and mailing address, the show division and classes marked.

4) Qualified Headstudy entries will be judged in their respective divisions.

Please make sure your class numbers are correct and legible.

<u>Please Note:</u> There will be eight different judges in different locations. If you are using the same photo for a halter and a liberty class (which you shouldn't be) it will not be judged in both of those classes. You must have separate photos, even if they are identical.

Prizes, Donations

MEPSA provides high quality cloth (satin) rosettes to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion horses, as well as cloth (satin) ribbons to Champions, Reserves and the remaining Top Ten. In addition, we make every effort to insure that all entrants receive at least one door prize or drawing prize. These prizes are donated by MEPSA members as well as others in the model horse hobby. Donors receive free full color advertising in the champ show book as well as acknowledgment. <u>Donations</u> may be sent with entries. <u>Donations</u> are a vital part of the success of the Championship Show. If you would like to make a donation, here are some ideas: models (any size, original finish or custom, perfect or imperfect), companion animals, tack, props, rider dolls, customizing services, photo services...basically, anything you would enjoy receiving is probably something that others would also enjoy. Donations may be used as either prizes or fund raisers. MEPSA also accepts monetary donations, which can be made via check, money order, or through our Paypal account. These help offset the costs of mailing prizes, printing the Championship Show book and purchasing ribbons and rosettes.

NOVICE SHOWS

The MEPSA Novice Photo Show Series provides newcomers with an opportunity to learn how to improve their photo show entries by using direct feedback. Entrants will be given individual private critiques on EVERY photo they enter, thus allowing them to see exactly what they can improve on. Photos will also be judged against one another (just like a regular photo show) and full results will be given to all entrants.

Some rules to remember:

Showers CANNOT enter Novice shows and OPEN shows at the same time. There is a maximum of 2 years allowed in Novice for showers over 16. Age 16 and under, no maximum. Graduating from Novice may occur prior to the maximum allowed time, if the majority of judges recommend moving up to Open. A shower may elect to stay in Novice for the maximum two years. It is recommended that a shower take advantage of the Novice shows and enter as many as possible during the two year time limit.

The Novice Division is designed to help you improve your photography, but the judge can also help you with other details, such as breed assignment, labeling your photo back, etc.

Novice showers may move up to the Open division, which also includes all Specialty shows, at any time. However, if they choose to do this before season's end, they CANNOT enter any further Novice shows and must forfeit all qualifications in the Novice Division for that Season's Novice Division Championship show. Once moved to Open, they cannot show in the Novice Division. All photography must be done by the entrant, no professional photography allowed. All Original Finish Plastic or China (OF), Custom (CM) and Artist Resin (AR) horses welcome.

FEES AND RULES: \$2.00 per show. PLEASE make check/MO out to the judge, not MEPSA!

Entrants may not enter more than 15 photos per show. All photos will be individually critiqued by the photo show judge and entrants will be given constructive criticism on how to improve their entries. Horses that place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any halter class in this series are eligible for the MEPSA Novice Halter Championship division and, in Performance, any horse placing 1st, 2nd or 3rd are eligible for the Championship Novice Performance division in the class they place in only!! The show format runs alternately, 2 halter, one Performance. (Halter-Aug, Sept, Perf-Oct, Halter-Nov, Dec, Perf-Jan, etc.)

STANDARD PHOTO SIZES ONLY – Show photos should be of uniform size. 4×6 photos are preferred, but 4×5.25 and 3×5 are also allowed. Any other size may be disqualified by the judge.

Entrants may enter one photo per horse in Halter. Enter each horse's photo in one gender class and one breed class. Example: An Arabian Stallion photo would be entered in classes 1, 5, while a Clydesdale gelding would be entered in 3, 8. You do not need separate photos for both sections. Do not send additional photos of other views. Pick the best side, and use that photo.

In Performance, it is one photo per horse per class in classes 13, 14, 18, 19. The remainder may have multiple photos of the horse as long as they are of different disciplines, i.e. Roping and Cutting in Western Stock Class or Arabian and Native American in Costumes. Duplicate photos will be DQ'd.

HOW TO ENTER:

IMPORTANT: NEVER write or put sticky notes on the front of your photos! All information must be on the BACK of your photos! Never on the Front!!

The information needed on your photo back:

Horse's name, breed, gender, color and make/mold information should be printed or written in ink on a label. Do not write directly on photo backs as it will smear and often transfers to other photos in humid conditions. DON'T use a Sharpie or any marker type pen as they can bleed right through the photo.

Class or classes entered – In Halter, this will be two classes, one for gender and one for breed type. In Performance, this will be only one class, and it helps to explain what your horse is doing. (Use pencil on a blank label. Some use scotch tape, but I dislike it as the pencil fades over time and the tape itself can leave sticky spots. Pencil is used so you can erase and remark the class numbers).

Your full name, your street address, city, state, zip code, email address and your five letter entrant ID code (1st two letters of 1st name and first three letters of last name-example: Marie Phillips-maphi). An address label is perfect and preferred for this information, but you may write it in pen on a blank label. Be sure it's readable! Bigger is better.)

Showers should put their photos in a ziplock bag to keep them clean, dry and together. It is not mandatory to do this, but it is good practice to keep your photos safe and should the envelope be damaged, they will get back to the shower.

WHAT TO SEND:

Don't forget your entry fee, to make sure your name and address is on EVERY photo back, that your classes are marked on every photo back, and that you have enclosed that very important SASE! What is an SASE? It's an envelope you have addressed to yourself, with that show's judge's address as the return, which is LARGE enough to fit all your photos, critiques, and results if needed, and is PRE-STAMPED with enough postage to mail home your entries, critique and results. You may request email results, but often the critiques are sent with the pix. This is very important, because otherwise, the judge cannot return your photos to you! **You need to put at least the same amount of stamps on the return envelope as it takes to send your package to the judge.** A lot of veteran showers will put an extra stamp in their photo bag with their name written on the back of the stamp in ink (just in case). Some even use Priority mail both ways to make it easier for all involved. Shows will run the third Saturday of every month.

WHAT IS YOUR ORIGIN STORY?

Now for a tale of origins in the hobby from one of our members! We hope you enjoyed the last submission in Volume 47! We have an entry this month, from Janet Cary! Thank you! Enjoy!

I was Janet Batts when it all began. I'm sure most of you can identify: I was born horse-crazy. I don't know where it came from – I was born in suburban Detroit MI, neither of my parents were into horses; I did have a grandma who admitted she was fond of them but I never pegged her as horse-crazy. I can remember watching TV shows on our black & white set – *My Friend Flicka*, *Mr. Ed*, and *Bonanza* in particular (I was in love with Little Joe and his pinto!). When I was about 5 years old Santa brought me the most glorious Christmas present ever – a buttermilk buckskin bouncy horse and turquoise & white cowgirl outfit, complete with hat, guns, and boots! That bouncy horse and I had SO MANY adventures together, and I still have it! I can remember when I thought my horse should be male, so I performed my first customization: I carefully cut a boy-part out of orange construction paper and taped it to his underside. Mom quickly made me take it off.

Around the same time, I started receiving Marx "Best of the West" horses, with Jane, Johnny, Josie, Jamie, Janice, and Jay. I had Flame, several Thunderbolts in various colors, Poncho Pony in both colors, Comanche (with the moving legs), the "moving neck horse", and culminating with the ranch, which was made of cardboard but a careful girl like me treated it well and it lasted for many years. I can remember pretending

that Jay West was Ken McLoughlin and the bay Thunderbolt was Flicka; so I took white tempera paint and gave her markings like Flicka – my second customization! Somewhere along the line the Breyer black pinto Western Pony was added into the mix, ridden by Josie West.

Every summer, my family would make the journey from Detroit to Hawley MN to visit my grandparents. How I loved that little town, nestled in farming territory, away from the crowded city! How I loved visiting relatives on their farms! One family in particular raised Quarter Horses and had a pony they let me ride. It was in Hawley MN that I discovered Hartland horses. My aunt had two horse/rider sets and my grandma had one large Champ horse. I also discovered that Hawley's Coast to Coast and Thyssel hardware stores had lightweight plastic horses and other farm animals – Hartlands -- unpainted but molded in a variety of basic animal colors, in open bins from which you could pick and choose. If I was a good girl, my mom would give me some loose change and I could walk downtown and choose some critters out of those bins. I ended up with quite a few over the years! But it always bothered me that they were unpainted...so out came the tempera paints again. They received black eyes, white markings, and a few them got painted entirely.

Back at home my best friends, horse-crazy sisters, lived in the house behind me. Oh we had glorious hours together playing with our Johnny West sets! I don't recall how it all happened, but somewhere along the line we discovered Breyer Horses. It was probably they who received the first ones, the glossy alabaster Five Gaiter for Michelle and the glossy grey appaloosa semi-rearing Mustang for Lisa. One day Mom and I were shopping at Eastland Mall in Harper Woods MI and walked by Circus World toys and there in a glass case was a glorious display of BREYERS! "Oh Mom, look!" There, above them all, standing glorious and proud was a perfect replica of Man O' War! I had just read the book by Walter Farley. "It's MAN O' WAR! Mom, could you get him for me? Pleasepleaseplease? *IT'S THE ONLY ONE I'LL EVER WANT!*" Priced at \$8.99, it was a pretty steep price for a toy horse and my parents were not well-to-do. But that horse came home with me that day and I was the happiest horse-crazy girl on earth.

Of course, Man O' War was NOT the "only one I ever wanted." Christmases and birthdays brought me Lady Phase, the alabaster Proud Arabian Family, Stud Spider.... And since I was getting older I was now given some responsibilities around the house and received an allowance for doing them. I remember saving up my money and buying the buckskin Quarter Horse Gelding, the sorrel Belgian, the bay Family Arabian Stallion, the very affordable Stablemates. Back then, Traditional Breyers came in a white box with a picture of the model on the box, and a Breyer Collector's Manual in each one. Michelle, Lisa, and I would pore over these booklets, marking which ones we had, drooling over which ones we wanted, and making our Christmas and birthday wish lists. I think it was through one of these booklets that I sent away to Breyer for a copy of their new publication, *Just About Horses*, which is where we learned that there was such a thing as MODEL HORSE SHOWING via photographs!

Instamatic cameras in hand, we started taking photos of our Breyers out in the lawn. It didn't take long to discover that it is difficult to take closeup photos with an instamatic camera, especially when you looked through the viewfinder but the actual lens taking the photo was an inch or so to the left. And even more disappointing was discovering the lousy photos after you shelled out your hard-earned allowance to pay for development of the film cartridge at Kmart.

In my teens now, my dad finally trusted me to use to his 35mm camera. I never did understand his little handheld light meter, and all the adjustments that needed to be made on the camera depending on what that little meter told us, but somehow or other I managed to get some acceptable photos of my Breyers. The world of PHOTO SHOWING opened up to me! I believe it was via a list of model horse publications and clubs printed in *Just About Horses* that I connected with some home-published magazines such as *Model Horse Shower's Journal, Model Horse Collector's Digest, Hobby Horse News* and others that advertised photo shows. I learned was a SASE was. I learned how to properly label photo backs. And I learned that I had a lot to learn before I could start getting any good placings at photo shows!

I also learned that people bought and sold model horses through those magazines, and I learned about Bentley Sales Company! As my responsibilities at home increased, my allowance increased and I began earning extra money by babysitting. Babysitting was awful, but it allowed me to purchase more Breyers. And of course Mom & Dad continued to come through for me at birthdays and Christmas. Through the model horse magazines I also learned that people customized their Breyers by repositioning them (which was called "remaking"), repainting them, and even adding mohair manes and tails. I was intrigued! I had sort of been doing this for a very long time – I just didn't realize it was a "thing" and I never would have dared to do it to a lovely Breyer. Unpainted Hartlands were one thing; beautiful-right-from-the-box Breyers were another! If I remember correctly, my first commissioned customs were a garage sale Western Pony painted to buckskin by Sue Rowe, and a SM TB Mare painted dark bay and haired by Sue Sudekum.

But it wasn't long before I jumped in myself. A stretch Morgan was one of my first victims, receiving no gesso base – I just slapped a few coats of acrylic burnt sienna on him and gave him a flaxen mane & tail. A black Shetland Pony followed soon after with a faux fur mane and tail. And then came...STABLEMATES! They could be purchased cheaply, repositioned easily, and painted quickly, being so small. There was something so appealing about them; so detailed for being so tiny. Oh goodness, I customized a host of them in my high school and young adult years! I gradually got better at it (using gesso now, LOL), even applying mohair manes & tails, or embroidery thread braids. And then...when I graduated from community college my parents gave me a wonderful Canon AE1-P camera that could take CLOSEUPS of the Stablemates! Another new world was opened to me.

About that same time I learned about live showing via Pam Young who reached out to me. When Pam held her very first Motor City All Halter Live Show, I was right there with Michelle and Lisa, who were of course learning all this model horse stuff right along with me. I didn't do very well at my first live show -I think I got one single placing – but I did meet Laura Hornick (Behning) and immediately fell in love with her work, purchasing a gorgeous bay Lady Phase custom named Valuable Asset.

Soon I got my first full-time job and the world of model horse showing opened even wider – because as we all know in this hobby, money = better models, better tack, better photography equipment, and therefore better placings! I added more Laura Hornick Behning models. My skill with customizing Stablemates got a little better; soon I was able to sell my minis at live shows. I still customized some larger scales too, although repositioning those proved too great a challenge for me.

Pam and I traveled to a lot of live shows back then, both within Michigan and the Midwest, and out east. I can't say I ever "made it big" -- not many Champs and never a Grand -- but we sure had a lot of fun and we made a lot of friends.

But things change. Eventually I sold off a number of models, earning enough money to purchase a REAL HORSE, dear old Sundance Lady, whom I enjoyed for a glorious 3 years until just before I got married. Then I made the tough decision to sell her, figuring I would lack time for her now, and as it turned out, we'd lack finances as well, so it really was a wise but sad decision. But I was still into collecting and showing Breyers. I was Janet Cary now. When our little daughters came along in the '90s I was still active in the hobby, even starting a photo showing club exclusively for minis – the Mini Model Horse Association – and generating a regular newsletter for it. I organized a few small live shows at my church, just for minis. I sold photography services. I was still customizing minis, now including some beautiful resins by Lesli Kathman and Donna Chaney/Animal Artistry. But as our daughters grew into toddlers then preschoolers, my time for the hobby had to become less and less as time for the family was needed more and more. In the late 1990s I decided it was time for me to bow out of the hobby.

I sold most of my collection except for my core group of pals from childhood and one custom Stablemate Draft Horse who was my first real successful show model (made by me, that is). I sold off all my nice tack. I packed away all my acrylic paints. And sadly, I became estranged from my model horse friends.

Life happened: we moved, we fostered an infant for a year, we got a greyhound, we got a pop-up camper. Model horses were no longer an everyday importance. The few I had became even fewer as I gave some away to my niece. By this time I was down to just Lady Phase, Stud Spider, the glossy palomino Family Arabians, Bright Zip, and the Appaloosa Performance Horse. I also kept all my original late '70s Stablemates and my set of seven Reigsecker's Draft Horse Stablemates from 1984. Then more life happened: the foster baby got permanently placed, and we tried a business which failed so we couldn't support the greyhound and had to give him up. Times were tough; we were forced to move to another state where my husband found a job.

We settled in the Buffalo NY area, attempting to recover from financial disaster. I was trying to think of ways I could earn money at home while still caring for our two girls. My thoughts naturally turned to the only thing I was any good at – customizing Stablemates. By then new molds had been introduced -- the Stablemates we now refer to as "G2." So in the early 2000s I started painting a few minis again, thankful that I still had my nice camera and backgrounds! I sold the customs on eBay, since I was otherwise disconnected from the model horse hobby. At this point, I didn't even have a place to display the few OF Breyers I still had, so they stayed packed away in boxes. Time was still very limited, however. I really didn't do a whole lot of customs to sell, but the few I did provided a little extra spending money once in a while.

In the 2010s I decided that I really *really* missed seeing my Breyers, so I finagled a way to get a bookshelf in the living room so I could display them. They all fit on one shelf. My daughters were way old enough by this time to leave them alone, so I didn't worry about that. But boy...now I sure missed the models I had given away to my niece! Why oh why had I done that?! The alabaster Proud Arabian Family, the glossy dappled grey Running Foal I had repaired the leg on (done very well, if I do say so myself), the Clydesdale Mare and Foal with their green blankets, the sandy bay Appaloosa Yearling, the alabaster Fighting Stallion I'd gotten as a souvenir in North Carolina, the "bubble butt" Belgian I bought in Pelican Rapids MN, and especially my glossy dappled grey Old Timer I bought in Florida.

And then a miracle happened. Out of the blue, my sister-in-law contacted me, asking me if I wanted those horses back, since my niece had now grown up and was no longer interested in them. I couldn't say yes fast enough! The next time we visited in Michigan, there was a lovely box of old friends waiting for me, and still in good condition; Old Timer even still had his hat! When I returned to Buffalo I couldn't get those things back on my shelf fast enough! Now I required *two* shelves on the bookcase.

Reacquiring those models kindled something in me; a wave of nostalgia washed over me; I embarked on a mission to regain all the vintage models I used to have, those from the '70s and early '80s. We were in a little bit better place financially, and the girls were teens now so didn't need much direct care. Through careful and thorough scouring on eBay I was able to pick up a whole lot of very affordable Breyers, much to my delight. I also started painting Stablemates more regularly again, to earn money with which to buy more OF Breyers. The mailman was bringing me a box almost every week. It wasn't long before the entire bookcase was filled! And happily by this time I had reconnected with my childhood friends Michelle and Lisa, and also my friend Kathy Blumreich and eventually Pam Young too.

But you know how the collecting bug bites hard. Soon I needed a second bookcase. By then it was 2016; my oldest daughter was getting married; my sights were set on her bedroom. Wouldn't it be glorious to fill her room with bookcases, then work on filling those? The wedding couldn't come fast enough!

And then another miracle happened. In addition to my husband's full-time job, he also was awarded the job as caretaker at our church in the tiny town of Marilla NY, in farm country. That position required moving into the house behind the church so he could keep an eye on things, unlock the church as needed, and do the snow removal. That house was a glorious 5-bedroom split-level, the lower level of which included a glorious study with SIX built-in bookcases! *O bliss, o rapture!!!* And super-cheap rent to boot!

Eight years later at age 61, here I am, living almost-in-the-country at last, typing this on the laptop in my Horse Room which has built-in bookcases, free-standing bookcases, and a curio cabinet. The collection stands at just over 800 with room for more. I have a dedicated workbench in another room for creating custom models to sell on eBay (still mostly Stablemates), I have two dedicated tabletops for taking indoor photos (digital now, LOL)...and I get to participate in MEPSA!
